Kibworth Community Hub

The Parish Council have received a request from Kibworth Beauchamp Council for help towards financing the new Community Hub at the Kibworth Grammar School Hall. This Community Hub will be the new location of the Kibworth library as well as providing a range of activities and support services enhancing health and wellbeing. "A focal point for social and recreational activities with the community library and the space to host events, groups and meetings on site. Commercial activities will provide a steady income stream."

Both Kibworth parish councils will have contributed over £95,000 during the process to date and the library has contributed £14,500. The s106 fund is just short of £264,000. Grants totalling £65,000 have been offered. The second lowest tender leaves the first phase of the project, the library, some £38,000 short, some of which will be made up with additional grant applications.

Tur Langton Parish Council are

setting the budget over the next month, so we would like to know if villagers would like us to include some monies towards this hub.
